

The board, as an agent of the state, must operate within the bounds of state and federal law effecting public education. If the Board is to meet its responsibilities it must not only shape local educational policy within the scope of these laws, but strive for passage of new laws and repeal or modification of existing laws necessary to create more effective boundaries for public education.

To this end:

1. The Board will develop its position concerning legislation effecting public education.
2. When appropriate, the Board will work for the achievement of common legislative objectives through the state and national school boards associations.
3. The Board will also seek both direct and indirect representation of its position on pending legislation with appropriate state and federal legislators and legislative committees.
