

The school district exists to provide publicly-supported education to district residents. The school district will enroll nonresident students to the extent required by the New York State Education Law and the policies of the school district.

A child's residence is the residence of his or her parents or legal guardian.

Any family or student meeting the definition of homeless or unaccompanied youth, under the McKinney-Vento Act, shall demonstrate residency within the district by:

- a) In a situation where a child and his/her parent/legal guardian are doubling up with a resident of the district, the Statement of the Johnson City District Resident Supporting the Residence of Non-Custodial Family Members (5151-E.1) form must be submitted.
- b) A child living in the home of a non-custodial parent, guardian or other adult must submit the Statement of a Non-Custodial/Non-Legal Guardian Resident of the Johnson City Central School District Supporting the Admission of Student as a Resident (5151-E.2) form and the Parent Affidavit (5151-E.3) form.

A family or student wishing to enroll in the district, but whose primary residence will be in the home of another adult (family member, friend, or otherwise) and are not considered to be homeless or unaccompanied youth under McKinney-Vento Act must submit the Statement of the Johnson City District Resident Supporting the Residence of Non-Custodial Family Members (5151-E.1) form. If the student is without a legal parent/guardian, the Parent Affidavit (5151-E.3) form is also required.

A student who seeks to be designated as an emancipated minor in the Johnson City Central School District must submit the Parent Affidavit (5151-E.3) and Statement of an Independent (Emancipated) Student (5151-E.4) forms.

Wards of any public welfare department residing in foster homes within the school district are considered residents of the district; however, the former school district of residency, from which they were assigned foster care, is responsible for the payment of tuition charges.

Exchange students residing in the school district are considered residents of the district.

A child placed for adoption in a home within the district shall be considered a resident of the district.

The term "migratory child" means any child whose parent(s) or others in custodial care are living temporarily in the school district for the purposes of seasonal employment. These children are considered residents of the school district.
